ANOTHER VEHICLE STRANDED ON HOLY ISLAND CAUSEWAY

At **3.05pm** on **Saturday 10th June 2006**, Humber Coastguard received a report of yet another car with three occupants, stranded on **Holy Island Causeway**, despite the recent media reports and safety warnings. Seahouses Inshore Lifeboat was requested to launch, as it was at first thought one of the casualties was handicapped. Due to the rough sea conditions and coastal fog, the Lifeboat was taken by road to Holy Island with the station Landrover. Local Coastguards from Holy Island and Seahouses were also turned out. On arrival at the causeway, the Lifeboat crew met with local police officers on scene, and were then cancelled by Humber Coastguard, after Holy Island Coastguard was able to confirm that all three persons from the stranded car, were safely ashore on the island side. The three persons were believed to be elderly, and none required medical assistance. The Lifeboat, still on its road trailer, then returned to station. The RNLI have no further information about the casualties, but Humber Coastguard may be in possession of their details.
