## FISHING VESSEL BROKEN DOWN 1.5 MILES OFF SEAHOUSES HARBOUR

At 2.14 pm on Sunday 14th December, 2008, Humber Coastguard paged Seahouses Lifeboat Operations Manager, and advised him that the 30ft fishing vessel "Dorothy May" had called for assistance, approximately 1.5 miles south east of Seahouses harbour. The vessel had two persons on board, and had suffered loss of steering and transmission problems. The All Weather Lifeboat Crew were paged for immediate launch, and on reaching the casualty vessel, it was found to have regained some engine power and steering, and was able to make its own way to Seahouses, under escort by the Lifeboat, Sea conditions were moderate to rough with choppy swells. Once safely at Seahouses, arrangements were made to investigate the casualty's mechanical problems. The vessel was on passage from Amble to St Abbs. The lifeboat returned to station at 3.10pm that day. Ends.
